
Evaluation at last

This is the last step to the activity after giving the visual aids to the students. The kit has three illustrations portraying different behaviours.


The teacher has to put these illustrations on a surface, could be a floor as well, and ask each student to put a dot on the behaviour they like.

The illustrations will further have to be kept back in the kit and must be given to the head for further evaluation.

For Teachers to know: This evaluation aim at understanding the preferred behaviour of the students. Expectations are that the friendly behaviour will have the maximum dots.


The three illustrations provided in the kit

Narration

Put all the scenes in a sequence, the order number is mentioned at the back of each scene.

Hold each scene in front of the class and start the narration by reading the text from the scenes...

Go slowly and feel free to give examples if you have any after the narration.

Discussion

After the narration, ask the following questions in the class and wait for the kids to answer.

After asking the kids, add to their answers with the answers given below and conclude the discussion by telling the moral of the story.

Questions:-

Q1) After listening to this story, what will you not do?

Ans.) We will not hit

Q2) Why should we not hit each other?

Ans.) Because god has given us hands to do something good and not to hurt someone

Q3) Now, can you promise not to hit anyone?

Ans.) Yes



Conclusion- Hands are not for hitting

Visual Aids

Ask all the students to rewrite on the text in the worksheet and trace their hands in the empty space provided.

Tracing can be done by keeping one hand on the paper and drawing around the hand to get the shape.

This exercise is meant to be done in the class. Students can later take this work of art home and paste it on their walls, etc.


